

Blakesley CE Primary School Uniform and Equipment

We request that uniform has our school logo and this can be bought from our suppliers online at SchoolTrends.co.uk (they will embroider it with our logos) or we hold some stock within school (please contact our office).

Uniform

- Red V-neck jumpers or cardigans
- White shirt or polo-shirt
- Red polo-shirt
- Trousers, skirts (knee-length), pinafore dresses (knee-length) or shorts (tailored) in grey or black.

The school has a tie which children can choose to wear and which we encourage our older pupils to wear.

Black shoes or boots (which should be 'sensible': no heels, open toes or flip-flops as these are liable to cause accidents).



We do not allow trainers, except for PE (or when children choose to change into their PE trainers at playtime for games activities).

Summer Uniform

During the months of May, June, July and September, pupils may choose to wear red and white gingham summer dresses.



On formal occasions (school performances for example) we expect that pupils will wear white shirts rather than red polo-shirts because these look particularly good against the red jumpers).

Pupils also need a lunch box (if they are not having a school meal) and a book bag.

Although we do not specify any particular coat, our PTA (FABS) sell a selection of fleeces and waterproof coats, embroidered with the school logo along book bags, swimming bags, swimming hats etc.

PE Uniform

For PE pupils wear white polo shirts or T shirts and black shorts, white trainers are required for outdoor activities.

Black tracksuit (jogging bottoms and top) should be worn in the cold weather.

We ask that PE kit is in school every day.

Pupils in Key Stage Two have swimming lessons and will need costumes, towels and hats of a designated colour (advised by the Swimming School Staff).

We have very little space in our cloakrooms and ask that PE kit should be kept in bags of a drawstring type, not bulky holdalls.



Please make sure that all property is clearly named – one red sweatshirt looks just like another one. We have a lost property bin located in the school hall. At the end of each term all unclaimed property is displayed and anything left is recycled.

Jewellery, other than watches, is not permitted with the exception of stud earrings. If pupils have pierced ears they must be responsible for the removal and safekeeping of their own earrings during P.E. We do not encourage pierced ears for safety reasons but would suggest that, if your child is to have their ears pierced they should have it done at the start of the long summer holidays so that they are able to remove them themselves for PE when they return in September. Pupils are not allowed to wear make-up to school. Long hair, for both boys and girls, must be tied back.
