Attendance

It is clear illness is having a negative effect on our attendance figures. At the start of the year a target of 96% minimum attendance for each pupil for the year was set. Whilst we know being poorly is unavoidable the importance of being in school every day cannot be stressed enough. Missed time away from school cannot be replaced. An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.

As stated previously attendance records are scrutinised regularly. Directives from NCC state that pupils with attendance figures below 90% must now be viewed as persistent offenders. In such cases, individual circumstances will be taken into account and also in the way in which communications will be made with families. This may be a quick word, a telephone call or a more formal letter where required.

Where families ask for permission to take their children out of school for holidays remember these days off school cannot be authorised. The importance of your child being in school every day cannot be stressed enough.



Punctuality

School doors are open from 8.40am and the registration period is officially between 8.50am and 9.00am. Any pupil arriving after 9am is marked as a late arrival. Being late for school reduces learning time. Being ready for school and being punctual certainly helps children settle more quickly for the day ahead. If your child is 5 minutes late every day, they will miss approximately three days of learning each year.



Values Passport

It is time to launch the second opportunity for children to participate in our Values Passport challenge.

Our Values Passport has been designed as a set of challenges and activities that link to our core values of COURAGE, COMPASSION, THANKFULNESS, FELLOWSHIP and WISDOM. Some activities are easier to complete, others are more challenging; some activities will need to be completed at home, others can be completed in school; some activities can be completed quickly, other activities will take a longer period of time.
