

#### Science week

The theme this year for British Science Week was 'Connections'. All classes have been engaged in scientific activities exploring connections within the biological, chemical and physical areas of science.



#### Class 1

Reception children investigated a range of bridges, then designed and made their own. They were thinking about which shapes were the strongest.









### Class 2

Class 2 are now experts in knowing if an object is living, dead or never been alive. The children made the connection between all living things being either animals or plants. They also thought about what they themselves need to survive and found out that all other living things have the same basic needs: to grow, to move, to reproduce and to have nutrition. The children had fun making up actions to remember these needs and realised that all four are linked and are necessary for survival.



## Class 3

Class 3 looked at the three main functions of a skeleton: protection, support and movement. Models of spines were made using string and paper straws. Lots of discoveries were made about various directions of movement, flexibility and rigidity.



#### Class 4

Science is about searching for answers. Class 4 have been thinking about of our universe and parts that we may not yet understand. They have been considering the question 'How did everything come from nothing?' Some of their thoughtful responses have been displayed on our 'Tree of Thoughts' in the foyer. Please have a read.
