Police visit/Blue butterfly

On Wednesday, all of our classes had the Blue Butterfly presentations by the local police team. The 'Blue Butterfly' is a project that takes its name from the term 'butterflies in the tummy' -the sensation people experience when they are scared. The aim is to help children recognise the emotions they might experience if something does not feel right. The mascot, the butterfly, acts as a reminder of the messages the children have been given about topics such as crime, bullying, violence, domestic and verbal abuse. Children should not keep fears to themselves and have been reminded of all the adults who can help them.

Congratulations to our Gymnastics team that entered the GLK competition, held in Northampton, last Saturday. For a number of our children this was the first competition that they had ever entered, and they did us all so proud.
