Length of school day

Thank you for the feedback received in response to my letter, dated March 1st 2023, regarding proposed changes to the length of the school day, here at Blakesley CE Primary School. The key issue raised by parents was the need for the same start/ finish times across the school.

In September 2023, there is a requirement from the DfE that all schools are open to all pupils for a minimum of 32.5 hours per week. The school day is measured from the time school officially starts to the time when children are released to go home. Therefore, changes to the school day will be implemented in September 2023 when the school day will commence from 8.45am to 3.15pm, for **all** pupils at Blakesley CE.

Further details will follow later in the Summer term.



<u>Attendance</u>

At the start of the year a target of 98% minimum attendance for each pupil for the year was set. Whilst we know being poorly is unavoidable, the importance of being in school every day cannot be stressed enough. Missed time away from school cannot be replaced. An average attendance of 90% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole year from school.

As stated previously attendance records are scrutinised regularly. Pupils with attendance figures below 90% are now viewed as persistent offenders. Regular meetings are taking place each term with the NCC attendance officer. Those children causing a concern are discussed in detail. Individual communications will be made with families. This may be a quick word, a telephone call or a more formal letter where required.

Where families ask for permission to take their children out of school for holidays remember these days off school cannot be authorised. The importance of your child being in school every day cannot be stressed enough.









Punctuality

School doors are open from 8.40am and the registration period is officially between 8.50am and 9.00am. Any pupil arriving after 9am is marked as a late arrival. Being late for school reduces learning time. Being ready for school and being punctual certainly helps children settle more quickly for the day ahead. If your child is 5 minutes late every day, they will miss approximately three days of learning each year.



Celebrating the Coronation

On Friday 5th May, at 2.30pm, there will be an open event for the whole school community and beyond. The school will be hosting an afternoon tea party. There will be cream teas available, a cake competition, plus artwork and writing on display for all to see.

Safeguarding: Emergency alert

This is a test. You do not need to take any action.

It is understood that most devices should receive the signal instantly, but some may need to be switched off for a minute or so to ensure the alert does not sound. Home to School Transport Consultation

West Northamptonshire would like to know your views on changes that they are proposing to the Home to School Transport service. These changes are required to meet increased demand and operating costs, whilst also exploring opportunities to give greater flexibility for parents and help to promote sustainable travel.

The changes that are being proposed in this current consultation will not come into effect until September 2024. The proposition focuses on a set of proposals, as well as providing opportunity to feedback on transport arrangements and a Draft Home to School Education Transport Policy (September 2024 to July 2025).
