Nationally, attendance figures for school are still lower than desired. However, at Blakesley CE, we are pleased to announce that our numbers are above the national average. Please be aware any absent child's family will be contacted by phone/e mail if no message has been given to the school office by 9.15am. Everyday, unless told otherwise, the expectation is that parents/carers inform us as to where their children are. There must be legitimate reasons for keeping a child off school. Records of all reasons given for absence continue to be kept.

All attendance figures are regularly checked. Families are being notified and challenged as to why any persistent absenteeism is continuing. The Local authority officer will also be contacting families that continue to cause a concern.



Home to School Transport Consultation
