Forest School

On Wednesday, Class 1 went to forest school for the afternoon. This was their first visit of six sessions planned. The children had an exciting time exploring the site, den making, playing games and using their senses to carry out some 'Spring stillness' which involved listening to nature, watching the effects of the wind and experiencing the sensation of touching and feeling unfamiliar surfaces.



Let's Get Playing

Class 2 (Y1Y2) appear to be loving their musical project called 'Let's Get Playing'. Each week a peripatetic music specialist from NMPAT (Northamptonshire Music and Performing Arts Trust) leads lessons with the class. The children have been learning about musical notation, following rhythms, learning how to play chime bars and singing together.
