Safeguarding: Keeping children safe

With the finer weather finally beginning to appear it is lovely hearing the children making plans of playing outside together after school, for example going to the park. Please have conversations with your children about staying on pavements, road safety and the potential dangers of traffic.

It would also be wise to have conversations at home with your children about staying safe whilst travelling to and from school. Remember, if your child is being collected from school by a different adult or family, the school office needs informing. If older children are walking to or from school independently, please take the time to discuss all possible scenarios with your child and inform your child's teacher of your arrangements.







At the end of the school day to keep everyone safe, all children need to be kept under close supervision and should **NOT** be playing on the playground or with any equipment. Please keep all younger children close at hand whilst waiting for older siblings.

Around the school gates please keep all dogs on a lead and away from other children. Recently, there have been some horrifying stories in the news about dangerous dogs. Whilst no dangerous breeds seem to be on show, no one ever knows for sure how a dog might react to an unfamiliar person or child. If it is necessary to walk a dog to school, please always be mindful of others and always keep dogs under tight control. No dogs are allowed on the school site.
